Our Learning

English:

This week we began an exciting new unit based on *The Jabberwocky* by Lewis Carroll. The children have been exploring Carroll's playful use of language, looking at the invented words in the poem and how they still create vivid images and meaning.

Maths:

As we return to fractions, the children have shown great resilience and determination while learning how to find a fraction of an amount. They have worked hard to apply their understanding step by step and are becoming more confident when solving problems.

Science:

We have begun our new unit on Animals: Circulation and Health. To introduce the topic, the children considered the types of questions a doctor might ask during an appointment and discussed why these questions help doctors understand a patient's health.

World Book Day:

We had a fantastic time celebrating World Book Day in school. Junior 5 created story boxes for KS1 children, while Junior 4 turned their favourite picture books into short plays, performing them with great enthusiasm.
