Home learning

Phonics: Phonics home learning has been sent home in children's plastic wallets.

Maths:

Year 1s: Y1s have been focusing on comparing mass using the words 'heavier, lighter and equal to'. Compare the mass of objects around your house ideally with balance scales but <https://www.roomrecess.com/Tools/PanBalance/play.html> is a useful site if you do not have balance scales at home. (Sticking to 1g weights on the above link)

Year 2: Y2s have been finding the mass of objects using grams and kilograms. Use the above link and experiment with mixed weights.

Next week's learning:

In English, we are excited to begin exploring a new story! (Top secret until Tuesday!!)

In maths, Y1 will be focusing on adding 1-digit numbers to 1-digit numbers. Y2 will be adding 1-digit numbers to 2-digit numbers.
